“Clinical Features & Functional Intervention Strategies for Autism Spectrum Disorders”

Program Summary:

Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) impact multiple areas of functioning and, consequently, demand a multidisciplinary approach to conceptualization, diagnosis, and intervention. Not only is there extreme variability within the autism spectrum, but across development as well. This presentation will outline the nature and course of ASD throughout development, and identify intervention strategies that address social communication and interaction skills, emotional awareness, behavioral regulation, and adaptive skills, as well as factors to consider for functional outcome in adulthood. This presentation will be geared towards parents and professionals who want to further their understanding of Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD).
